Trail Rules

The following rules are enforced by park personnel. Failure to follow these rules may result in legal action and/or being banned from park property:

- Park in designated parking only
- No alcoholic beverages
- No ATVs or dirt bikes allowed No other motorized vehicles without permit
- Use trash receptacles
- No fireworks or open fires
- Discharge of firearms prohibited
- Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control
- Clean up after pets
- Fighting, bullying, or offensive language is prohibited
- Respect others and use headphones when listening to electronic devices
- Do not disturb vegetation, trees, or wildlife

- Do not attempt to cross the Barry Campbell Wet Bridge when it is covered by water.
